**GROUP SHOW FROM APRIL 4 TO MAY 18 AT THE GALLERY LWS**

A year ago, the LWS gallery was being expanded to initiate a reflection on new faces to take on. To celebrate this first anniversary and illustrate this other line of research, works of seven artists, known and unknown, from different ages and backgrounds, take over the gallery to transform its space.

By gathering Pierrette Bloch, Soo Young Chin, François Génot, Mario Giacomelli, Muriel Moreau, Anne Laure Sacriste and Bertrand Secret, the LWS gallery confirms this distribution logic of works from both French and international artists, performing in a wide range of domains such as collage, photography, drawing, engraving and painting. This event recalls the aim of making the gallery a space for discovery and promotion of young as well as recognised artists.

Presenting some works made especially for the occasion, some taken from secret portfolios and others coming from far places, the desire of this exhibition is to show how contemporary creation can meet on topics repeating from one generation to the next, beyond borders. Around great figures in the art and photography history such as Pierrette Bloch and Mario Giacomelli, younger and less often represented artists as François Génot, Muriel Moreau and Anne Laure Sacriste display their talent, making this heritage a part of their language.

Mixing up supports, approaches, lights, colours and textures, works all gather here around their reference to nature and to naturalness.

From April 11 to 14, 2013, the LWS gallery will be a part of **DRAWING NOW PARIS / LE SALON DU DESSIN CONTEMPORAIN (booth A1)** which will take place at the Carrousel du Louvre and will present works on paper from Soo Young Chin, Vanessa Fanuele, François Génot, Anne-Laure Sacriste and Isabelle Taourel.
